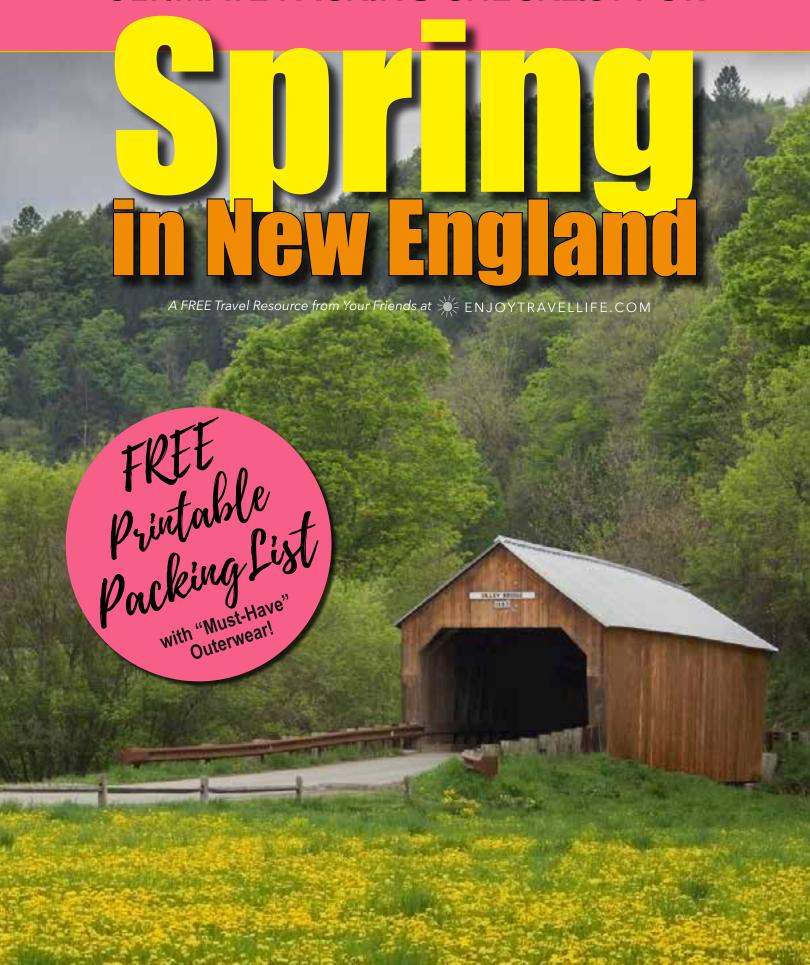
### **ULTIMATE PACKING CHECKLIST FOR**
